<b>STOMP-STYLE PERCUSSION</b>	
<p>Stomp is a percussion group known for using their bodies and ordinary objects to create a physical theatre performance using rhythms, acrobatics, and pantomime. Instead of using drums, they create sound using basketballs, car parts, brooms, glass jars and more. The group formed in the United Kingdom in 1991. They have performed around the world, have a Broadway musical in New York City, and have an IMAX film.
